


Molson Bilingual Option Programme allows French-speaking students to maintain fluency in their mother tongue and English-speaking students to reach higher levels of skill in French. Many courses are offered in both French and English across the curriculum.

A Great Place for Learning

A perfect blend of picturesque landscapes, historic architecture and modern facilities, BCS provides the ideal school venue for your departure into a whole new world of higher learning and discovery. The latest addition to our campus, Hartland Molson Hall, was constructed in 2004 and features the stunning 120-seat R. Lewis Evans Memorial Theatre with computer-controlled lighting, a workshop, and a studio which is home to the digital filmmaking programme. This building also houses a modern, sound-proofed music facility, a student centre complete with a recreational lounge, and the Peter Holt Memorial Library which contains 20,000 volumes, AV materials (490 CD-ROMs, DVDs, and videos), 45 periodical titles, and four prominent online services.

The recently renovated Pattison Science Building boasts nine science labs, including newly designed electronics and optics labs, and a computer lab. BCS also offers an exceptional and eclectic art studio.

work and play alongside people from as close by as the United States or Mexico and as far away as Vietnam or Australia.





Words! Words! Words!
















Active Mind, Active Body Active Body, Active Mind

Fine Facilties at Your Fingertips

Two squash courts and Canada's oldest indoor hockey rink can also be found on campus. Outside facilities include six sports fields, three tennis courts, a running track, and several kilometres of wooded cross-country trails. Finally, a university swimming pool and the local golf course are within walking distance of campus.


Cadets

or even attending the opera.







How to find us




From Boston: Take Interstates 93 and 91 to Vermont and Sherbrooke (4.5 hours)

From New York – Albany: Take Interstate 87 to Montreal

From Montreal:

- Cross the Champlain Bridge going South and follow Autoroute 10 East for approximately 145 kilometers.
- Exit 143 to the right, keeping on Autoroute 10 East
- Take Exit 146 to Boulevard St. François, turning left at the stop sign.
- Drive along the river and go through 1 traffic light at **rue King** (by bridge).
- Continue to the end of the road.
- At stop sign, turn right along rue Bowen Sud.
- Cross 1 traffic light at **rue Galt** and continue along this road, descending a hill and bear to the right at the stop sign under a train trestle bridge.
- You are now on rue St. Francis.
- At the 3rd stop sign turn left onto Chemin Moulton Hill in Lennoxville and enter at the BCS Campus sign stating 1st entrance.

Cancellation: Supplementary Services may be canceled by the parent in writing, without penalty, prior to July 15th for the following year or, subsequently, by forfeiting the April 15th Reservation Installment and Supplementary Services' Deposit if canceled in writing by the parent prior to September 1st.

The Advanced Placement® Programme (AP®) at BCS

The Advanced Placement Programme® (AP®) at Bishop's College School

BCS has been an AP School for almost twenty years. The programme was introduced to benefit motivated students keen on studying university-level courses. The College Board in the United States established AP in 1955. This cooperative programme between universities and participating schools has grown to include half of all secondary schools in the U.S. and approximately three hundred fifty high schools in Canada.

What is the Advanced Placement Programme®?

The Advanced Placement Programme®(AP®) is a challenging academic programme designed to provide motivated high school students with college-level academic courses. Students are exposed to university-level content and expectations in AP courses, allowing them to feel more comfortable and have more confidence once they reach the academic setting of university. At BCS, AP content is taught concurrently with the School's curriculum and compliments the university preparation courses already offered.

Paving the Road to College or University...

Approximately three thousand North American universities and fifty-three (53) Canadian universities recognise Advanced Placement courses and examinations including UBC, McGill, Western and University of Toronto. Students presenting qualifying grades on AP Exams may earn anywhere from three to six credits in a given subject, thereby earning second-year standing in that subject. European universities also recognize the AP programme.

AP Standards

AP exams are administered world-wide and graded according to rigorous AP standards by 6000 university professors and experienced AP teachers. Traditionally, BCS students score significantly above the Canadian national average on these exams.

Each AP exam is given a grade on a five-point scale:

- 5 Extremely well qualified
- 4 Well qualified
- 3 Qualified
- 2 Possibly qualified
- 1 No recommendation



The Advanced Placement® Programme (AP®) at BCS

What is the difference between the Advanced Placement Programme®(AP®) and the International Baccalaureate (IB)?

The International Baccalaureate (IB) is another rigorous pre-university programme leading to examinations in six subject areas. The two-year IB diploma is typically completed by students in Grades 11 and 12, and features a broadly based curriculum that includes languages, social studies, experimental sciences, mathematics, and electives. IB candidates have the option of choosing to study subjects at Higher Level or Standard Level. For the IB diploma three subjects must be taken at the higher level.

Why AP?

BCS opted for the AP programme over the IB for a number of reasons. While IB is also highly regarded by universities, the cost is more prohibitive. IB does not link its programme to university criteria, and IB curriculum is less flexible. IB also requires students to have overall proficiency in all subjects in order to participate, whereas AP is more democratic, available to students who may not be interested in all areas or who do not excel across the board. The flexibility of the AP programme allows BCS students to maintain their co-curricular interests. In 2003, a special committee was formed to re-examine the benefits of the AP programme in comparison with the IB programme. The committee arrived at the conclusion that AP was a more natural fit with the School's philosophy and our already rigorous academic curriculum.

The T.H.P. Molson Bilingual Option Programme



To have **mastery of more than one language** is to enjoy a tremendous advantage in life. The T.H.P. Molson Bilingual Option Programme at Bishop's College School provides you with an exceptional opportunity to learn a second language and to **benefit from the unique cultural richness** of Quebec and Canada.

WHAT DOES THIS PROGRAMME INVOLVE?

The carefully structured courses in the T.H.P. Molson Bilingual Option Programme are designed to help English-speaking students attain a working practical knowledge of French and to help French-speaking students achieve the same goals in English. An example of courses offered in both French or English through the T.H.P. Molson Bilingual Option Programme are shown in this chart.

It should be noted that students may write their final exams in the language of their choice (French or English). This assures that they are in no way penalised when confronted with exams from the Ministry of Education.

WHAT ARE THE PROGRAMME'S OBJECTIVES?

BCS emphasizes the highest linguistic standards. Its aim is for graduates of the programme to leave the School with language skills they can use with ease, whether in an academic, professional, or social setting.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

BCS Application for Admission

Applying to Bishop's College School

Application Procedures:

- 1 Parents complete, sign and date the appropriate sections of the application for admission and send it with the non-refundable application fee of \$100 to the Admissions Office at BCS. They are to enclose **two passport size photographs** of the applicant. Canadian applicants should provide a copy of their birth certificate showing the names of both parents. International students must include a copy of their passport pages.
- 2 Students complete the student portion of the questionnaire.
- 3 The parents must request that the applicant's school complete the Confidential Report and mail or fax it directly to BCS.
- 4 The school must attach copies of the applicant's final report card (translated into English if applicable) from the previous year and the most recent report card from the current year. The final report of the current year must be submitted prior to admission in September.
- 5 Contact the Admissions Office to make an appointment for the admissions interview.
- 6 All applicants write a BCS Math entrance test, and all applicants whose first language is English write a BCS English entrance test. Results from SSAT completed within the current year may be submitted in lieu of these tests.
- 7 All applicants whose first language is not English require an official language test score: either the BCS ESL Test or SLEP (Secondary Level English Proficiency) for applicants Grades 7 to 10; or TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) for Grades 11 or 12 applicants.

A decision regarding admission is made only when the application file is complete.
